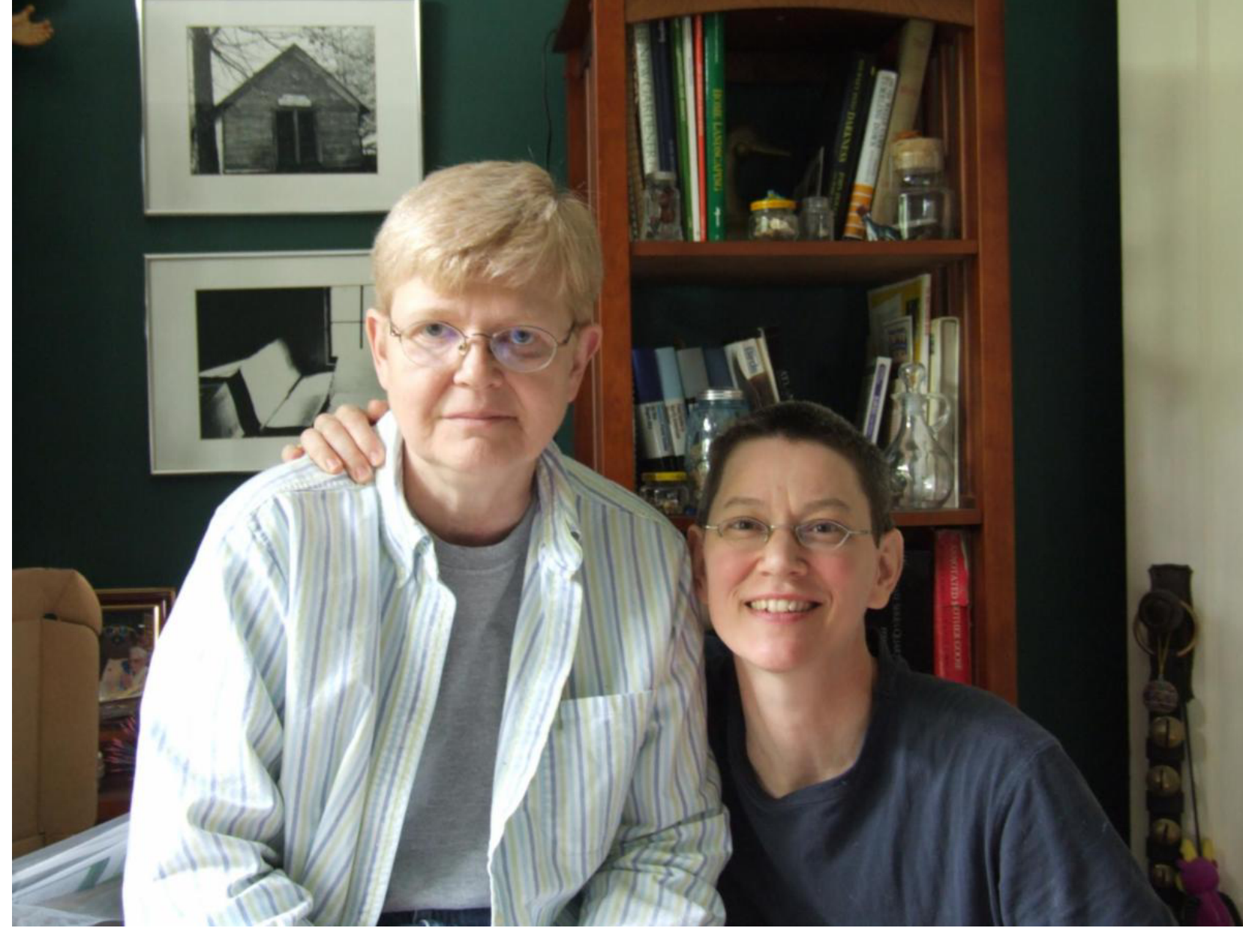
A WKU student was the victim of a collision Friday evening and later pronounced dead.

She realized her attraction to girls at 12 years old, which “terrified” her because of how both society and the generally Baptist population of Beaver Dam then viewed the queer community.

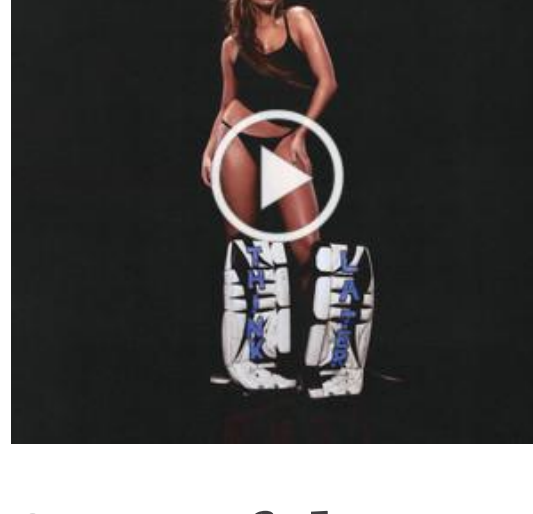
The Championship win made WKU 29-4 overall in the season with a 24-game win streak.
